MOLLY SMITTEN-DOWNES will fly the UK flag in Copenhagen next week with her song Children Of The Universe. From Leicestershire, the 27 year old had a Top 10 hit in 2008 with Raindrops (Encore Une Fois), but is now hoping for solo success. Will Eurovision help or hinder?

We've never heard of you before...

I've been involved in the music industry for years. I did some dance stuff, but four years ago I stepped away from that to focus on the music I really wanted to do. The downside of that is I have to pay bills, so I worked in Topshop for 18 months until February.

How did you get the Eurovision gig?

I was uploading my music to BBC Introducing, a platform for undiscovered artists. Then the Eurovision Executive Producer heard it and got in touch to ask if I'd have a go at writing something.

Did you have reservations about Eurovision?

At first I said no, it isn't for me. But they persuaded me to come in for a chat. It became apparent they wanted to do something new and they didn't want a household name. I did a U-turn and started thinking, 'S**t I've got to do this.'

But it's so political - no one votes for the UK...

I've heard people say it's political, but looking back at the previous winners and our

entries, you can see why we've not won. They're good songs, they're just not contemporary. I'm just hoping the best song wins and not politics. Ask me again on May 11th and I might be really bitter saying it's all politics, they hate us!

You've written your song, and you're singing it. You'll have to grow a thick skin.

everybody will
like it.


What's your song about?
